# 1 Introduction

The purpose of this report is to raise awareness of noise matters and increase understanding of the nature and type of noise complaints in the Republic of Ireland. Additionally, it will serve as a source of useful information for various agencies, Local Authorities, relevant Government Departments, key influencers and the media. It is also hoped that this data will induce change and promote recognition, classification and quantification of noise as it affects the public as an environmental pollutant.

This report also gives insights into the impact noise pollution has on citizens across the entire country. It is proposed that this report should be considered by the Irish Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the Department of Communications, Climate Action and Environment (DCCAE) during the development of future noise policy within the Republic of Ireland, and to examine the effectiveness of noise pollution-reducing measures already in place. This report is compiled using self-reported noise complaints gathered via www.noisecomplaint.ie. This research is the first of its kind ever undertaken within the Republic of Ireland.

Data collection for this report took place from the First of May 2018 to the Thirtieth of April 2020. It is analysed as two segments

Period 1: First of May 2018 to Thirtieth of April 2019. Period 2: First of May 2019 to Thirtieth of April 2020.\* \*(Note that Period 2 included 7 weeks of 'lockdown' due to Covid-19)

The data in this report is broken down into four key categories of noise sources: Transport, Commercial, Domestic, and Sports and Entertainment. This allows for concise information delivery and analysis of the most prevalent causes of noise complaints. Each of the four categories are further divided into subcategories, as seen in Table 1.

# 2 Noise

Sound is the reception by the human ear of vibrations or sound waves and is essential on many levels as a key element of daily life. Noise, however, is defined as sound that is unwanted and causes disturbance in daily life, irritation, stress and aggravation. Noise is a frequently occurring pollutant that can damage hearing at high enough levels. Noise in the surrounding environment can be caused by human activity, air, rail or road travel, and commercial activity. The World Health Organization (WHO) have stated that after air pollution, environmental noise pollution is the second most prevalent cause of poor health. The many health risks stemming from noise pollution include; pain, hearing loss, poor mental health, communication difficulties and sleep disorders. Studies by the European Environment Agency have shown that noise pollution is the primary cause of more than ten-thousand deaths in Europe each year. Additionally, noise disturbance has a significant impact on cardiovascular health and has been associated with heart disease, increased blood pressure, and links with stroke and dementia.

# 3 Noise Complaint Details

As previously outlined, this data will be analysed according to two periods, as follows:

Period 1: First of May 2018 to Thirtieth of April 2019.

Period 2: First of May 2019 to Thirtieth of April 2020.

There was a 48.78% decrease in the number of complaints received in Period 2 when compared with Period 1. Again, we note that Period 2 included 49 days after March 12<sup>th</sup> 2020, being the date where measures to combat Covid-19 were introduced, generally referred to as 'lockdown'.

# 3.1 Period 1

### Sources of Noise

Data analysis shows that of all the complaints logged, that noise from neighbouring properties appears to be the most notable source of the complaint being the source of one-third of all noise complaints logged. No complaints from some noise sources such as shipping, recycling or noise from fireworks were logged during the course of our research. This may have been due to the geographical location of the complaints and events that may have occurred during the sample period.

In second place to noise complaints from neighbouring properties, traffic noise was the source of almost 18% of all complaints, and industrial noise resulted in just under 10% of all complaints. In summary, neighbouring properties, traffic noise and industrial noise were found to be the greatest source of complaints logged in this observation period.

### **Reporting the Complaint.**

When respondents were asked if they had reported their complaint to any local authority, the EPA, DAA, TII or any other person or body 65.85% stated they had reported their complaint, while 34.15% had not reported the complaint.

The 65.85% of respondents who said they had reported their complaint were also asked to indicate who they had reported this complaint too. Many of the respondents had reported their complaint in more than one place. The most frequent response was the Local Authority, where 46% of complaints were reported. Following that, the Irish EPA and the Gardaí accounted for 11% of reports each. The DAA accounted for 4% of complaints, while TII accounted for 3%. Respondents also described reporting their complaints directly to the source, local councillors, citizens' information and the Minister for Environment.

#### Occurrence of the Noise.

46.3% of complaints received reported being affected by the noise throughout the day, evening and night, in other words, at all or any time of day. Following this, 17.1% of complaints affected complainants mostly during the night. The third most prevalent response was being affected by the noise during the daytime and evening which accounted for 10.6% of responses.



# 3.2 Period 2

#### **Sources of Noise**

In this second period, from to May 1<sup>st</sup> 2019 to April 30<sup>th</sup> 2020, similarly to Period 1, noise from neighbouring properties is the most prevalent complaint, comprising 28.6% of all complaints lodged. Entertainment noise from a venue or bar was the second most noted complaint accounting for 22.2% of complaints, followed by Industrial noise at 15.9%. No complaints were received about Noise from Fireworks, Power Generation, Aircraft, Wind Turbines, or Shipping ports, as well as Sports, Quarry or Recycling Facility noise. Construction noise and noise from barking dogs or livestock both accounted for 9.5% of complaints.

### **Reporting the Complaint**

When respondents were asked if they had reported their complaint to any local authority, the EPA, DAA, TII or any other person or body 68.25% stated they had reported their complaint, while 31.75% had not done so.

The 68.25% of respondents who said they had reported their complaint were also asked to indicate to who they had reported this complaint to. Many of the respondents had reported their complaints in more than one place. 39.1% of complainants stated that they had reported their complaint to their Local Authority; this was the most frequent response. After this, 21.9% had reported their noise complaint to the Irish EPA, 10.9% had reported to the Gardaí, closely followed by 9.4% of persons who described complaining directly to the source of the noise disturbance. Other responses included two complainants reporting to the Fire Brigade and individuals complaining to Transport Infrastructure Ireland (TII), elected officials, solicitors, property management, etc.

### Occurrence of the Noise.

Over a third of complainants (36.5%) reported being affected by the noise throughout the day, evening and night. 34.9% of complaints, again over a third of complaints, were reported as being prevalent throughout the night. After consideration of the periods above, 14.3% of complaints stated that the noise was heard throughout the evening and night.

### 3.3 Comparing Both Periods

#### Sources of Noise.

In both periods of data analysis, noise from neighbouring properties was the most prevalent complaint. However, in Period 1, entertainment noise was the second most pervasive, strongly contrasting with traffic noise being the second most frequent in Period 2. Industrial noise was frequently reported in both periods.

### **Reporting the Complaint.**

The percentages of complaints reported remained similar between periods 1 and 2, 65.85% and 68.25%, respectively. Local Authority was consistently most frequently reported to, followed by the EPA and the Gardaí.

### Occurrence of the Noise.

The majority of complainants reported being affected by their noise complaints during the day, evening and night in both periods of time. However, being affected throughout the night by noise was second most frequently reported by complainants in all data.

# 4 Noise Complaint Locations

In the course of overall data collection from August 31st 2017, to May 5th 2020, noise complaints were reported from all counties in the Republic of Ireland, bar Louth and Longford.

# 4.1 Period 1

In this observation period, Dublin county had the highest overall percentage with a total of 33.3% (Fingal: 8.1%, South Dublin: 11.4%, Dublin City: 13.8%). The county of Dublin accounts for approximately a third of all complaints received during this measure. Following this, Cork has less than half the amount of complaints, 14.6%. This aligns with the higher population density in Dublin compared to Cork.

# 4.2 Period 2

During this period, again, Dublin county had the highest percentage of complaints,53.9% total (Fingal: 9.5%, South Dublin: 22.2%, Dublin City: 22.2%). Over half the complaints submitted came from Dublin county. Dublin county accounts for a significantly higher percentage of the complaints made in comparison to the 33.3% in Period 1. Cork is again second highest in the rate of complaints, 12.7%, followed by Donegal and Limerick with 6.3% of the complaints each.

# 5 Sectors that give rise to most complaints

As previously discussed, noise from a neighbouring property, road traffic noise, industrial noise, construction noise, entertainment noise and barking dogs and livestock gave rise to the most complaints.

Shipping Port and Distribution Centre Noise, Recycling Facilities/Metal Processing Plants, Noise from Fireworks or Firecrackers were not complained about in either period. In addition, quarry Noise, Sports Noise, Rail Noise, Wind Turbine Noise, Noise from Power Generation and Clay Shooting/Rifle Noise received minimal complaints.
